

ORDINANCE NO. 2

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING ANY PEDDLER, ETC. FROM REMAINING ON THE PREMISES OF ANOTHER AFTER BEING ORDERED BY THE LAWFUL OCCUPANT TO LEAVE, PROVIDING A PENALTY FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BELLS, TEXAS, THAT:

Section 1:

It shall be unlawful for any peddler, salesman, solicitor or other person who goes on the premises of another person to remain on such premises after he has been ordered by the lawful occupant thereof to leave.

Section 2:

It shall be unlawful for any person to go upon the premises of another person situated within the city, without the consent of the occupant, owner, or person in charge of such premises, to break, cut, or pull, or take from the premises, or trample upon, the flowers, shrubbery, grass or garden vegetables, growing thereon.

Section 3:

It shall be unlawful for any person to go upon the premises of another person situated within the city, without the prior consent of the owner, occupant or person in charge of such premises, for the purpose of distributing flyers, handbills and other advertising material.

Section 4:

It shall be unlawful for any person to go upon the premises of another person, without the consent of the occupant, after such person has been forbidden or warned by the occupant, owner or person in charge of such premises not to go upon the premises.

Section 5:

The provisions of this ordinance shall not apply to licensees, tenants in common of the premises, landlords, meter readers, and other persons who go on the premises in pursuit of lawful business.

Section 6:

Any violation of the provisions of this ordinance shall, upon conviction, be punished by a fine not exceeding TWO HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$200.00).

Section 7:

The dire necessity of providing some protection for the City of Bells, Texas, creates a public emergency, and all rules

and provisions requiring the reading on three (3) separate occasions is hereby suspended, and this ordinance shall take effect from and after the date of its passage.
